Standardised Operation of School Zone Times

The Queensland Government has mandated standardised school zone times to improve compliance within school zones and remove confusion for motorists travelling between Local Government Areas.

The new school zone operating times for all schools in Queensland will be standardised to 7-9 am and 2-4 pm, unless specifically signed.

Key dates:

By 16 April 2012, signage for all school zones across south-east Queensland will be upgraded to 7-9 am and 2-4 pm;

By 9 July 2012, all schools outside south-east Queensland will have standardised school zones for their council area.

To cater for school and regional circumstances, the Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) will consider exemptions to this policy and extensions to the times.

TMR Regional Road Safety Managers are working with councils outside south-east Queensland to help determine the appropriate times for each area. Time adjustment application forms are available through these representatives or on the <u>TMR website</u>.

If your Local Government Area is outside south-east Queensland, and you haven't yet been contacted by TMR to discuss your needs, contact your regional manager on the details provided on the <u>TMR</u> website.

The website also provides detailed fact sheets relating to the school zone reforms.

Infrastructure Charges Advisory Panel to be Created

LGAQ has confirmed its participation on a panel to provide advice on the implementation of the infrastructure charges reform program.

On 12 April 2011, the State Government released its response to the Infrastructure Charges Taskforce final report, outlining a three year reform package to implement the 10 Taskforce recommendations for reform. In response to the Infrastructure Charges Taskforce recommendations, an infrastructure charges advisory panel is being formed by the State Government. This advisory panel is expected to provide advice on the implementation of the infrastructure charging reforms, including:

- the introduction of a deferred payment mechanism;
- the role of infrastructure related development conditioning; and
- the application of infrastructure 'credits and offsets

The advisory panel will also perform an evaluation of the interim infrastructure charging reforms including consideration of the maximum adopted infrastructure charges.

The State has requested representation from LGAQ on the panel, which will also include representatives from the development and legal industries as well as the various relevant State Government departments.

The Association is in ongoing discussions with the State Government regarding increasing local government representation on the panel, albeit no formal decision will be made until after the State Government elections.

The LGAQ will also be forming a local government infrastructure charges working group to support our advisory panel representative by providing comprehensive, technical and timely advice. Further information and details on the working group will be provided shortly including formal invitation;

The change of the Local Government election date from 31 March 2012 to 28 April 2012 also has unavoidable follow on consequences for the term of both the LGAQ Policy Executive and Board, necessitating further change to the LGAQ Constitution.

The LGAQ apologises for the inconvenience of asking members to vote on another "rule" change, but the matter and timing are completely out of our control. Moreover, if we don't amend our Constitution it would result in the Association having no Policy Executive or Board for a considerable period of time.

Pleased be advised that a resolution of Council is not required under the LGAQ's Constitution. However, if the Council wants to take it to a General Meeting, that is lawful, but entirely a matter for the Council.

Please find attached the Notice of General Meeting pursuant to Rule 4.2 and the specific ballot paper for your council.

As indicated on the Ballot Paper it can only be signed by the Mayor or CEO of the Council. All Ballot Papers have been forwarded to Councils by Registered Mail and must be returned to me in my capacity as Returning Officer either by **hand** or in the **registered post envelope** provided by **5pm** on **26 March 2012**.

It is most important your council votes on this matter because under the Corporations Act 2001 a vote in favour of proposed changes must achieve 75% support of all eligible votes.

In the event that you do not receive or lose the Ballot Paper sent by registered mail on receipt of a statutory declaration to that effect I will reissue the Ballot Paper. We will be conducting a search with Australia Post on **Friday 16 March 2012** to ascertain whether all dispatched registered mail has been signed for.

In accordance with rule 4.14 of the LGAQ's Constitution, the chief executive officer has determined that this special general meeting be convened by postal voting.

As a consequence, all voting papers (as attached) <u>must be received by the chief executive</u> <u>officer (returning officer)</u> by not later than **5.00 pm** on **Monday 26 March 2012**.

The business of the Special General Meeting is as follows: -

Motion 1

<u>Purpose:</u> To enable retiring or defeated councillors who are Executive Representatives on the Policy Executive (and Directors appointed to the Board) to continue in their roles for a maximum period of 90 days after the conclusion of a quadrennial local government election

Actual text of proposed amendments:

In rule 5.2(1): -

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The date for this year's local government elections has changed to 28 April 2012.

It is understood that no local government election results will be declared until 8 May 2012.

As a consequence, it is highly unlikely that the LGAQ's members will have sufficient time to consider election of policy executive representatives within the timeframes presently prescribed by the LGAQ's constitution and rules (i.e. 1 June 2012).

The constitution and rules have been reviewed and amendments are being proposed to resolve this difficulty. In fact the amendments proposed will not only extend the timelines for this year's policy executive elections, they will no longer link the requirement to conduct the elections to a specified date. Rather, the changes proposed will require elections for policy executive members to be concluded within 90 days of the quadrennial local government elections, whenever that date might be.

The amendments proposed also confirm that existing policy executive members (and the President) remain in office until the next policy executive has been elected.

The final amendment is a minor one, merely updating a legislative reference (in relation to the definition of "Quadrennial Election").

Port of Abbot Point - Cumulative Environmental Impact Assessment

Dear Sir/Madam

I write to advise of a new environmental initiative underway at the Port of Abbot Point. The port is located north of Bowen in northern Queensland and is adjacent to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park.

The current port operator and the proponents of new port capacity at Abbot Point are committed to best practice in environmental design and management. The companies have come together to undertake a comprehensive investigation of environmental impacts from their proposed projects at the port through a Cumulative Environmental Impact Assessment.

The Port of Abbot Point is one of three existing coal ports in Queensland and has been identified by the Queensland Government as a preferred port to support further development of the coal export industry. It is seen as critical to economic development in Central and North Queensland, as underlined by the Government's designation of a State Development Area at Abbot Point.

The Cumulative Environmental Impact Assessment process will be wide ranging and involve 15 detailed studies in the following areas:

Shipping

Marine Water Quality

Dredge Plume Modelling

Operational Noise

Groundwater

Wetland Hydrology and Water Quality

Underwater Noise

Visual Amenity

Lighting

Coastal Hydrodynamics

Species and Habitat Assessment

Dust

Climate Change

Fishing

Joint Offsets Strategy

The studies are being undertaken by recognised scientific experts in their fields and in turn will be independently reviewed and then consolidated into one overall report. The draft report will be available for public comment before finalisation and submission to the Commonwealth and Queensland Governments.

Responsibility for individual studies is being shared among the project proponents. For example, BHP Billiton has carriage of a reef wide study of shipping. This study is looking at current and potential shipping movements through the reef and in consultation with ports, maritime safety organisations, and the shipping industry will examine future management arrangements to ensure protection of the reef.

Further details on the individual studies, including the shipping study, are outlined in the attachment to this letter.

The Commonwealth Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities (SEWPaC), the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority (GBRMPA) and the Queensland Government have been consulted in the preparation of the impact assessment framework and schedule.

The information from the Abbot Point Cumulative Environmental Impact Assessment study in turn will inform the assessment of the different projects at Abbot Point under national and state environmental law.

The information gathered at Abbot Point will also be available to feed into the two strategic assessments recently announced by the Federal and Queensland governments on future development in or near the Great Barrier Reef World Heritage Area. The Abbot Point Cumulative Environmental Impact Assessment will therefore be complementary by providing an information baseline for subsequent project proposals.

Interested stakeholders and members of the public will be invited to comment on the draft Cumulative Environmental Impact Assessment Report. Advertisements seeking comments will be placed in *The Courier Mail* and local newspapers in July or August this year. Cumulative Environmental Impact Assessment Studies

The table below outlines the scope of the technical studies underway that will inform the cumulative environmental impact assessment being conducted at the Port of Abbot Point. The studies cover proposed expansion of the current port facility (T0), new terminals and offshore berths proposed by BHP Billiton (T2) and GVK-Hancock Coal (T3) as well as the new terminal capacity (T4 to T9) at that forms part of a proposed Multi Cargo Facility (MCF) being managed by North Queensland Bulk Ports Corporation (NQBP).

Study	Scope of cumulative assessment work
Dredging and dredge plume modelling	 Assessment of the combined footprint, turbidity, sediment plumes, seabed (seagrass and benthic) and habitat impacts of dredging activities associated with all proposed developments. Sediment testing and analysis. Analysis of dredging risks to marine mammals, turtles and other species.
Spoil disposal	 Full multi-criteria analysis of spoil disposal options including onshore and offshore options. Analysis includes consideration of environmental, engineering, social and cost factors.
Underwater noise	 Assessment of the sound propagation and environmental risks associated with piling works for new offshore trestles; sheet piling and rock placements for MCF. Temporal and spatial effects of overlapping activities and/or effects of consecutive activities. Mitigation measures relevant for different scenarios and sensitive environmental factors (e.g. whales, dolphins).
Species and Habitat Assessment	 Assessment of the impact to migratory bird habitats, threatened species and vegetation communities in and near the port. Habitat modification from light, noise, dust and water quality changes on migratory birds etc. Ecosystem function and health. Identification of infrastructure design and mitigation methods to reduce impacts.
Groundwater	 Interpretation of existing data to determine impacts on groundwater storage and movement, wetlands and flows. Development of a groundwater monitoring plan. Identification of infrastructure design and mitigation methods to reduce impacts.
Operational noise	 Calculation of the noise envelope emanating from the construction and operation of new terminals and MCF (separately and collectively) on port and nearby environments. Particular focus on wetland (listed migratory birds) and nearby beaches (turtles). Identification of noise limiting technologies and impact reduction strategies.
Coastal hydrodynamics	 Assessment and modelling of any resultant changes to coastal processes, tidal/current movements and sediment transport as a result of terminal jetties and the MCF.
Wetland Hydrology and Water Quality	 Build a current data set of wetland and overland flow hydrology dynamics Determine changes resulting from new terminal and MCF construction, including effects of sedimentation pond overflow risks and water quality impacts. Identify design improvements and mitigation measures to reduce any unacceptable impacts.

Study	Scope of cumulative assessment work
Visual amenity	 Expert view representation of proposed port developments. Analysis of visual aesthetics from a number of viewpoints including Bruce Hwy, Bowen and offshore. Assess whether landscape at Abbot Point is materially changed. Examine against existing landscape character and values; human access and appreciation; WHA values of universal outstanding value as demonstrated in other parts of the Great Barrier Reef. Identify measures to reduce visual impact on local residents and key user groups (e.g. fishers, tourists)
Lighting	 Model light shed on wetland, beaches and marine environment. Assess impacts to birds, turtles and other wildlife. Identify design improvements and mitigation measures to reduce any unacceptable impacts.
Dust	 Model dust deposition from terminal operation on listed threatened and migratory species, wetland, marine environments and human settlements. Identify design improvements and mitigation measures to reduce any unacceptable impacts.
Shipping Reef wide component	 Outline the international, national and regional controls relating to shipping. Outline current shipping management arrangements in the Great Barrier Reef. Analyse current and future shipping activities in the Great Barrier Reef. Identify potential environmental implications at a reef wide level. Determine and articulate likely shipping environmental risks. Analyse likelihood and consequence of ship groundings and collisions. Identify risk management measures.
Abbot Point component	 Examine anchorage locations, waiting times and impacts. Outline the potential for transfer of exotic marine species (via both ballast water and biofouling). Examine ship waste management (garbage, sewage, oily waste). Calculate atmospheric emissions (pollutants and greenhouse gases). Consider port vessel movements during construction and operational phases. Visual and lighting impacts.
Fishing	 Examine the implications to commercial and recreational fishers during construction and operation of an expanded port.
Climate Change	 Examine the carbon emission footprint of the port's design, construction and operation. Identify mechanisms to reduce and offset greenhouse gas emissions from the port. Ensure port design has accounted for possible climate change effects such as sea level rise.
Joint Offsets Program	 Develop a coordinated offset program involving all port operators at Abbot Point to: address all residual impacts and provide a net gain enable proponents to contribute proportionally focus on Abbot Point, wetlands, nearby locations and MNES provide scalability for future projects

FIRST APPROVED ARRANGEMENT ANNOUNCED FOR NATIONAL TELEVISION AND COMPUTER RECYCLING SCHEME

Parliamentary Secretary for Sustainability and Urban Water, Senator Don Farrell, today announced that DHL Supply Chain (Australia) Pty Ltd has been approved as the first

organisation able to deliver services under the National Television and Computer Recycling Scheme.

The Scheme will provide Australian households and small businesses with access to free collection and recycling services for televisions, computers, printers and computer products.

As administrator of an approved co-regulatory arrangement, DHL is now able to sign up television and computer manufacturers and importers, and collect and recycle products on their behalf. It is also responsible for ensuring the arrangement meets the scheme's recycling targets.

Senator Farrell said the approval of DHL is an important next step for the industry-run National Television and Computer Recycling Scheme, and further announcements of successful applicants are expected shortly.

"Having a variety of providers is expected to lead to more options, both for the community in how they dispose of unwanted televisions and computers and for manufacturers and importers in terms of which provider they join," he said.

"It is vital to the scheme's success that organisations applying to establish a co-regulatory arrangement are able to demonstrate that they can meet the scheme's strict operating criteria, and I congratulate DHL for doing just that."

DHL will administer the first of a number of co-regulatory arrangements that will be able to deliver collection and recycling services for televisions, computers and computer products nationally. Services under the new scheme are on track to commence in mid 2012, with access to services expanding across Australia by the end of 2013.

The National Television and Computer Recycling Scheme aims to boost the recycling rate for televisions and computers from 17 per cent in 2010 to 80 per cent by 2020-21, and to provide a long-term solution to television and computer waste

"Televisions and computers contain valuable non-renewable resources including gold and other precious metals as well as hazardous materials including lead, bromine, mercury and zinc. By recycling them, we can recover useful materials and at the same time reduce health and environmental risks."

Approved co-regulatory arrangements are required to:

- achieve annual targets, starting with a 30 per cent recycling rate for computers and televisions in 2012-13 and rising to 80 per cent in 2020-21;
- complete rolling out reasonable access to free collection services across Australia by December 2013;
- meet a material recovery target of 90 per cent by 2014-2015 onwards;
- and ensure that appropriate occupational health and safety and environmental practices are in place.

The industry funded and run National Television and Computer Recycling Scheme is regulated by the Australian Government under the landmark *Product Stewardship Act 2011*.
