We refer to the above and the constant issue that arises when it rains in the Brandon area.

Over the years calls have been made to you in relation to such issue and unfortunately the problem persists.

On Thursday 22 January 2015 the water backlog on the corner of Banister and Evans Street was by far the most amount of water backlogging seen by us over the years with a relatively small amount of rain recorded.

We contacted the council in relation to this issue and Ms. Perina DalleCort and Gary Keane attended on the area to discuss the issue with us.

We advised the council representatives that we believe recent road upgrades to the Bruce Highway at Sandy Corner and agricultural runoff have exasperated the problem.

It was suggested to such council representatives that the backlog problem could be alleviated by diverting the water to Sheepstation Creek. Survey levels have been taken from Munro Street following the existing drain down to the Brandon State School carpark. These levels proved the drain to be relatively flat.

From Brandon State School to Sheepstation Creek further levels were taken, the result of which shows that there is a half-metre (500mm) cut required to divert the water flow back to Sheepstation Creek. Attached hereto is a copy of the recorded survey levels.

We request that action be taken by the Council to alleviate the water backlog that currently exists in Brandon, in particular the area surrounding Banister and Evans Street.



#### **Advice to Councils Regarding Councillor Vacancies**

**Circular:** 2015-002

Release Date: Wednesday, 11 February 2015

The Local Government Act 2009, Section 163 provides direction as to how to respond to a vacancy in the position of Mayor or Councillor.

The most relevant timeline relates to a vacancy that occurs between 18 months and 6 months prior to the quadrennial election. For reference purposes the 6<sup>th</sup> month cut-off is calculated as Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> September, 2015 noting that the Local Government Elections are slated for Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> March, 2016 (Saturday 26 March 2016 will be Easter Saturday). This change of date still needs to be confirmed by Regulation.

If a councillor vacancy occurs prior to the 19<sup>th</sup> September, 2015 council will have 12 weeks in which to appoint a replacement, or risk the right of the appointment transferring to the State.

Under section 166 a vacancy in the role of councillor that occurs between now and 19 September 2015 may be filled by appointment. On the other hand, if there is a vacancy in the role of Mayor between now and 19 September 2015, that role must under section 164 be filled by by-election.

If a councillor vacancy were to occur after the 19<sup>th</sup> September, 2015 council can choose whether to fill the vacancy or not – it is allowable for the councillor role to remain vacant until the quadrennial election. If however the role of Mayor becomes vacant within 6 months of the quadrennial election the Deputy Mayor (appointed under s 165) fills the vacancy until the election. If there is no Deputy Mayor an acting Mayor (also appointed under s 165) may fill the vacancy until the election.








# 100 YEAR ANNIVERSARY COMMEMORATIVE POSTER

Since the early days of nationhood, both Australia and New Zealand have sent servicemen and women to many conflicts in all parts of the world to defend our country and to ensure the luxury of freedom and democracy that we enjoy today.
