Australians should no longer tolerate the silence and ignorance that has surrounded domestic violence in this country. All of us have a responsibility to prevent this ugly and loathsome facet of society from claiming any more victims.

Premiers, sports stars and media figures have publicly joined together to condemn domestic violence and urge the public to encourage respect for the vulnerable in our midst, especially women and children.

As local community leaders, we have a special role in all of this. We need to take a public stand against this all too common blight in our communities.

Domestic violence touches all parts of society and all levels of income. More and more of us now know it is happening in our communities and now is the time to take positive and decisive steps to reduce it.

I urge you to support the LGAQ's Safer Families, Better Communities campaign by organising public expressions of opposition to domestic violence. Your community is like all others in Australia _ appalled and ashamed at what such attacks are doing to the fabric of family life and to the notion that everyone have a right not to live in fear.

A march and rally against domestic violence has been organised for 11 October in Brisbane. Thank you for meeting with us on our recent extended visit to the central, north and far northern regions of the State. Reconciliation Queensland Co-Chair, Peter Jackson and I appreciated the opportunity to learn about and discuss first hand the key challenges in your communities to progressing constitutional recognition and addressing emerging reconciliation priorities affecting us now as a nation. We also appreciated the further opportunity we had to met with local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander organisations and other businesses/organisations with a Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) in the region as well.

It is good to know we can move forward on some matters now and as promised at our meeting, this communication is to confirm and formalise our request for Council's support in providing a suitable venue/s for local public information forums and assistance in promoting them within your local communities. We see great benefits in our organisations working together to conduct these forums locally and Reconciliation Queensland respects Council best knows the needs of local communities and will ensure it liaises with Council and other organisations as required about the timing, organisation and promotion of:

- public forum/s for constitutional recognition in major population centres within the Council area.
- a forum to discuss strategies to support emerging reconciliation priorities for the region.

Reconciliation Queensland can assist with keynote speakers from the national Recognise Campaign for speakers panels at public forums in the Shire as well as providing a facilitator for the forum with representatives of local organisations and Council. Where possible we will seek Council's assistance in coordinating the timing of forums in the Shire with those being held in other Shires in the region. We appreciate this opportunity to work in partnership with Council to better inform and coordinate our efforts to support local reconciliation initiatives for local communities.

I look forward to our next meeting and thank you again for your ongoing support of reconciliation for all Queenslanders. To progress matters quickly can you please advise details for key persons in Council we should now liaise with in relation to organising upcoming forums.
