## Welcome roads, water, housing funding in 2015-16 Federal Budget

The LGAQ welcomes the 2015-16 Federal Budget's confirmation of allocations to major projects and the continuation of essential community infrastructure funding programs.

Queensland will receive continuing support for major infrastructure works, including the final \$100 million contribution to the Moreton Bay Rail Link, \$493 million towards the Toowoomba Second Range Crossing and \$558 million towards upgrading the Bruce Highway. There will also be future benefits from the proposed Melbourne to Brisbane inland rail project, with an allocation of \$594 million for corridor establishment.

There is continuing support for regions indicated in the confirmation of allocations for the Northern Australia Roads, Beef Roads and Bridges Renewal initiatives. For 2016-17 and 2017-18, Queensland has been allocated \$62.7 and \$131.4 million for Northern Australia Roads, \$21.9 million each year for beef roads, and \$27.8 and \$24.9 million for bridges renewal. This funding will be divided between State and local roads and bridges.

Roads to Recovery funding for Queensland councils will be \$163.7 million in 2016-17 and \$142.4 million in 2017-18, twice the 2014-15 level of funding consistent with the commitment by the Federal Government.

Drought assistance funding allocated to Queensland's drought-declared communities for projects that stimulate the local economies or provide long-lasting benefits to communities and agricultural industries will be \$11.3 million in 2016-17 and \$3.3 million in 2017-18.

The natural disaster contingent payments under NDRRA allocated to Queensland for 2016-17 are \$23.6 million in 2016-17 and \$10.6 million in 2017-18. Estimated cash payments to reimburse Queensland for costs incurred in relation to past disaster events are \$746.2 million in 2016-17 and \$596.0 million in 2017-18.

Natural disaster resilience funding allocated to Queensland in 2016-17 is \$12.0 million. Future allocations are noted as being the subject of current negotiations between the Commonwealth and States on the terms of the Federal Government's revised funding arrangements.

Pest and disease preparedness allocations for Queensland are \$16.5 million in 2016-17 and \$17.1 million in 2017-18. The funding contributes to programs to eradicate exotic animal and plant pests and diseases, which if allowed to establish and spread, would have serious economic and environmental impacts.

The National Partnership on the Water Infrastructure Development Fund will provide funding of up to \$450 million through to 2019-20 to part-fund the capital construction costs of a small number of high priority water infrastructure projects to help secure the nation's water supplies and deliver sustainable economic benefits for Australia. Individual State allocations are yet to be determined.

A *National Water Infrastructure Loan Facility* will also be established from 1 July 2016 to provide concessional loans to co-fund the construction of water infrastructure projects such as dams, weirs, pipelines and managed aquifer recharge projects.

The National Partnership on developing demand-driver infrastructure for the tourism industry has allocated to Queensland \$2.9 million in 2016-17 and \$2.0 million in 2017-18. This Partnership fund is administered by the State Department of Tourism, Major Events, Small Business and the Commonwealth Games, and is open to applications by local government and community groups. Financial Assistance Grants for Queensland will total \$450.1 million in 2016-17 and \$468.1 million in 2017-18. The Identified Road Grant, now called the Local Road Component, is maintained as an untied allocation for expenditure by councils.

Despite the strong case made by the LGAQ and ALGA for the immediate re-instatement of Financial Assistance Grant indexation, Budget Papers indicate that it will continue to be frozen in 2016-17 and is due to be re-instated from 2017-18.

Councils will recognise that the three year 'freeze' has effectively lowered the base on which future indexation will be calculated. This will mean that Queensland councils will receive an estimated \$42 million less through Financial Assistance Grants each year than would be the case if indexation had been maintained.

The *National Partnership on remote Indigenous housing* supported reform in the provision of housing for Indigenous people in remote communities to address overcrowding, homelessness, poor housing conditions and severe housing shortages. From 1 July 2016 it will be replaced with the *National Partnership on remote housing*, which will facilitate the delivery of housing upgrades, new houses and housing-related infrastructure. Allocations to Queensland for 2016-17 are \$133.5 million and \$111.7 million for 2017-18.
