To the CEO Burdekin Shire Council,

I wish to submit an idea to Council for consideration.

An event similar or identical to the Southern Downs Shire, Town of Leyburn,
Annual Sprints. This event is held in Leyburn over two days (Weekend) around
approx. 23rd August each year.

Leyburn street circuit to conduct the sprints remains in place all year around.

Brown and white tourist directional signs for approx. 50KM around Leyburn all point to Leyburn Sprints.

The infra structure is minimal, concrete barricades (Constructed from Concrete Batching plant leftovers)

to prevent runoff in areas requiring protection, and runoff areas if available on some corners.

The Burdekin Shire could do better than Leyburn by having graffiti artists decorate the concrete barriers.

The Leyburn circuit is through the township, residential areas, past their local school.

The area on the Western side of the Railway tracks, in Home Hill would be ideal for a sprints circuit to be established permanently with both Gravel and Bitchumen surfaces, reasonable circuit length, adequate corners and through sufficient residential/rural farming areas.

NO PITS, NO GRANDSTANDS, would be required.

Just vacant land areas for parking of partisipants etc.

Accommodation facilities in Home Hill would be completely inadequate, therefore a major

spillover would occur into Ayr and surrounds and be a substantial ecenomic boost for the Shire as a whole.

Sprints are time trial racing of a single car around the circuit, to obtain hopefully the best winning time for that class/engine size vehicle. Only one car is on the circuit at any one time.

Running of the sprints could be by local car club or community organization with community emergency services involved, ie on standby with revenue raising stalls also operating.

Perhaps council would consider sending an investigating committee to this years Leyburn Sprints.

Home Hill Sprints could be held before or after the Leyburn Event .

I have mentioned this idea to Uli my local Councilor for raising with council formally.

I am writing to explain how the Department of Natural Resources and Mines (DNRM) place naming policies impact your organisation and explain our joint responsibilities for place naming and addressing in Queensland.

As the Minister for Natural Resources and Mines, I am responsible for naming and defining locality boundaries in Queensland in accordance with the *Place Names Act 1994* (the Act). Locality names and boundaries, in conjunction with the road names and addresses allocated by your local government allow the allocation of unambiguous location addressing. My department also takes responsibility for managing Queensland's central register of location addresses as supplied by local governments, for distribution to third parties.

Consistent and accurate place names and addresses are the basis of a number of vital activities including the provision of emergency services, postal addressing, statistical analysis and map production. As leaders of the key authorities responsible for these integrated activities, I believe we should be working together consistently and efficiently, particularly when it comes to improving public safety for emergency services.

Changing locality names and boundaries is governed by place naming legislation which also applies to naming or changing the names of identifiable geographical features such as creeks and hills. The principles supporting place naming activities are similar for both localities and geographical features and have been developed for consistency within national naming and addressing guidelines.

Place names are intended to be enduring so as not to cause undue confusion over time. Any suggested changes to existing place names should demonstrate sound reasons and long term benefits to the whole community. When considering suggestions my department takes into account issues such as:

- Community views, Indigenous tradition, commonly known names, topography, and avoidance of confusion about names.
- The likely impact of the action on the community and other stakeholders.
- If the suggestion is about a locality/suburb, whether there are any anomalies with road and address data in the area as these should be dealt with in the first instance.
- Whether the suggestion is similar to an issue that has already been considered, or a proposal that has already been developed within the previous five (5) years.

I acknowledge your local government's authority in allocating addresses, knowledge about your community and future development plans, and the direct impact locality changes can have on your business. DNRM's Place Naming Policy requires that suggestions about locality name or boundary changes include support from the relevant local government.

All place names suggestions submitted to DNRM must be in writing and so as to remain inclusive, will be considered on a case by case basis. At a minimum they must contain:

- The name and address of the individual/organisation making the suggestion.
- The details of the nature of the suggestion, including whether it is about giving a name, changing a name, discontinuing a name or changing a boundary.
- A reason for the suggestion which explains why the current situation should be changed.
- A map, diagram or text describing the location and extent of the suggested change.
- If about a new name, information about the history/origin of the name, including references, sufficient for DNRM to consider the suitability of the suggested name.
- A letter of support from council which includes acknowledgment that it may need to reallocate location addresses, if required, and notify affected persons.
- Documentation showing widespread support from affected persons including, if relevant, acknowledgement that they may need to change all their location and postal address details. It has been reported, in some cases, that it has taken many years for some organisations to update the addressing details of customers when there have been changes made to locality/suburb boundaries. This has caused much stress and concern to affected residents and also resulted in long periods of confusion.

Should your council be approached by the community or your local authority wish to initiate a name or boundary change, your consideration of the naming principles and suggestion requirements would assist in ensuring accurate, timely and public safety conscious address and place name outcomes. This is particularly important where suggestions relate to locality name or boundary changes because of the impact it has on safe and accurate addressing.

In addition to considering any incoming enquiries from your community, I strongly urge consideration for locality boundary changes very early in the planning stages of any new developments that may arise, particularly where residential areas expand into rural and semi-rural areas creating new communities. Identifying and actioning required boundary changes in these early stages can avoid the stress and confusion that often occurs if changes need to be made after occupation.

I hope this information has been of value and I trust we can continue to work together so that Queensland can have confidence in authoritative and accessible place names and addressing information.

- Identify issues for resolution at the state level to support your local needs.

There will be representation from key state agencies and other stakeholders however the focus of the workshop will be local management issues.

### Federal Election: Political Party Responses to Queensland Local Government Policy Plan

As part of the LGAQ's drive to improve links with the federal government, the Association launched the Queensland local government federal election policy plan in May. The LGAQ approached four political parties for a formal response: Labor, the Coalition, the Greens, and the Glenn Lazarus Team.

The LGAQ has received responses to the ten point plan from Labor, the Greens, and the Coalition. No response was received from the Glenn Lazarus Team.

The most favourable response received was from the Greens who partially or fully agreed to almost all requests from the LGAQ including agreeing to double and making permanent the Roads to Recovery Programme.

The LGAQ has prepared a summary of the responses received as at 28 June 2016 for the benefit of members.

Highlights from the responses and policy announcements by the parties to date include:

- agreement from Labor, the Coalition and the Greens to some form of consultation with local government around the new disaster funding model;
- support from all major parties for the resumption of the indexation of Financial Assistance Grants (FAGs) in 2017-18;
- agreement to fund additional mobile black spots; and
- agreement from Labor and the Greens on all requests in the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities and Housing sections of the policy plan.

The LGAQ is committed to working with whichever party wins the 2 July election in advancing the issues put forward in our plan. The LGAQ has been actively promoting the plan with key contacts in all major parties including holding more than 50 meetings with Ministers, Shadow Ministers, MPs, Senators, candidates and their offices and will thus be well positioned to progress these issues with the incoming government.
