Dear Councillor McLaughlin

I am writing to you about the infrastructure charges that local governments may levy for development under *the State Planning Regulatory Provision (adopted charges) 2012* (the SPRP).

To account for the effect of inflation on the maximum charges, the new *Planning Act 2016* makes provision for automatic annual indexation of these charges. The Act is due to commence in 2017.

I am mindful, however, that the maximum charges have not been increased since they were introduced in 2011 and, as a result, many local governments have been facing increasing shortfalls in their ability to fund necessary infrastructure.

I am therefore pleased to advise that I have decided to increase the SPRP charges by gazette notice in July 2016, as provided for under sections 629(2) and 629(3) of the *Sustainable Planning Act 2009*.

A new charges schedule will be made available when the gazette notice is published. Apart from the different amounts of the charges, the SPRP will not change in any other way.

RESIDENCY

A nominee is a resident of a town/city/shire if they consider the town/city or shire their primary place of residence. For example, several nominees are required to train and compete for extended periods internationally to compete at the level they have attained; however, they return to their permanent residence within their host local authority when in the NQSF region. Membership of local sports club or association assists proof of residency. North Queensland born Golf Star Karrie Webb is an example of a person who **could not** be nominated because she resides full time in another country.
