5 GOVERNANCE & LOCAL LAWS

5.1 Expression of Interest for Use of Bosworth Bar - Ayr Showgrounds

Executive Summary

Council at its meeting held on 2 August 2016 resolved to call expressions of interest for use of the building at the Ayr Showgrounds known as the "Bosworth Bar". Following public advertisement, one expression of interest was received from the Burdekin Cruisers Car Club Inc.

Recommendation

That Council agrees to enter into an agreement with the Burdekin Cruisers Car Club Inc. for the use of the Bosworth Bar at the Ayr Showgrounds for a term of 10 years subject to terms and conditions including but not limited to the following:

- Use of the building will be granted by Council at a peppercorn rent to benefit the community.
- The Burdekin Cruisers Car Club Inc. (the club) at its own expense shall maintain and keep the building clean and in good order and condition to the satisfaction of Council.
- The club shall not make any improvements of a structural nature (including signage) without prior approval of the Council.
- A public risk policy of not less than twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) must also be kept current for the term of the agreement by the club. The policy must indemnify the Council against actions, suits, claims or demands of any kind.
- The club shall be responsible for its share of electricity charges arising out of its occupancy of the premises.
- The premises must be made available free of charge to the Ayr Pastoral Agricultural & Industrial Association Inc. for a period of 2 weeks each year for the Burdekin Annual Show.
- The club shall make the premises available to other community groups at mutually agreed times which shall not interfere with the operations of the club.
- The agreement may be terminated by either party giving 3 months prior written notice.

5.2 Environmental Levy Application - The Debona Project

Executive Summary

Bruno Debona with support from the Lower Burdekin Landcare Association has applied for \$5,375-00 from the Environmental Levy fund to undertake "The Debona Project". The intention of the project is to revegetate a section of property located on Rita Island Road, Jarvisfield with native trees to encourage wildlife back to the area and to promote an active link and corridor with Plantation Creek. The proposed land is approximately 200 metres x 40 metres in size and is not owned by Mr Debona. The property is privately owned.

Recommendation

That Council not approve the application for the following reasons:

- a) The proposed area is private property and the landowner has not been contacted;
- b) The site requires Burdekin Shire Council to carry out a great deal of work in clearing the land, bringing in approximately 200 to 300 cubic metres of fill and levelling of the area:
- c) The proposed site is part of Plantation Creek so in the event of a flood all the work would be washed away; and
- d) There is not considered to be any long term environmental benefit to Burdekin Shire Council or the Community.
