### INVITATION TO SUPPORT NATIONAL ASBESTOS AWARENESS MONTI 1-30 NOVEMBER 2017

Dear Lyn and Terry,

I'm writing to invite you and Burdekin Shire Council to support Australia's only National Asbestos Awareness Month Campaign throughout November, so together we can help save the lives of people in your community.

I became a staunch advocate for the Asbestos Awareness Campaign after losing my good mate, Aussie actor Harold Hopkins, to malignant mesothelioma, a cancer that can develop 20-50 years after inhaling asbestos fibres. There is no cure and the average survival time after diagnosis is 10-12 months. With your help, together, we can stop more deaths from this devastating and preventable cancer.

Each week 13 Australians die of asbestos-related diseases, 12 from malignant mesothelioma. Another 13 are diagnosed with this hideous disease. Tragically, this number is predicted to rise in coming years due to homeowners, renovators and tradies disturbing asbestos and releasing fibres that can be inhaled by adults and kids during home renovations.

Although there's no known safe level of exposure to asbestos fibres, what we do know is that the greater the exposure, the greater the risk of developing asbestos-related diseases. Understanding the dangers of asbestos and knowing how to

One of our greatest challenges is that most Aussies wrongly believe that deaths caused from asbestos are a thing of the past, but they couldn't be more wrong! I know deadly asbestos lies hidden in one third of Aussie homes. It can be in any brick, weatherboard, fibro or clad home built or renovated before 1987. It was used everywhere - lurking under floor coverings including carpets, linoleum and vinyl tiles, behind wall and floor tiles, in cement floors, internal and external walls, ceilings and ceiling space (insulation), eaves, garages, roofs, around hot water pipes, fences, home extensions, garages, outdoor toilets, backyard and farm structures, chook sheds and even dog kennels.

If well maintained and undisturbed, asbestos isn't likely to pose a health risk to families. However, without knowing the types of asbestos-containing materials (ACM) to look for, or the dangers of asbestos and how to manage these products safely, homeowners, renovators, tradies and handymen play a very risky game of 'Renovation Roulette' putting their lives and the lives of others, at risk.

By working together we can encourage renovators and tradies to visit asbestosawareness.com.au where they'll find userfriendly life-saving information including the Asbestos in Your Home - The Ultimate Renovators Guide video and the 20 Point Safety Check. They can search Australia's only Asbestos Product Database, download Fact Sheets and the user-friendly Asbestos Awareness Healthy House Checklist - A Homeowner's Guide to Identifying Asbestos-Containing Materials. The Checklist is a step-by-step guide that helps homeowners conduct a fast and easy visual inspection of their home, - we are

manage it safely can help save lives.







Tradies are most at risk because they're more likely to come into contact with asbestos in their day-to-day work. While some tradies have worked with asbestos in the past and ignored the warnings, we want them to take the warnings seriously by learning where asbestos might be, how to manage it safely and when to engage trained experts to conduct asbestos-related work or remove asbestos-containing materials safely.

Fact Sheets and the Residential Checklist for Tradies – A Tradespersons Guide to Asbestos are valuable tools for every tradie enabling them to conduct simple visual inspections of properties to know potential risks ensuring asbestos is managed safely and in accordance with regulations.

Participation is free! Simply register at www.asbestosawareness.com.au/register and you will be given access to Asbestos Awareness Month Campaign materials including pre-prepared media releases, online banner/social media tiles, posters and flyers (in multiple languages), information kits, briefing notes and social media guides. All are freely available for registered participants from the downloads page at asbestosawareness.com.au.

Each and every Australian has a responsibility to learn about the dangers of asbestos and how to manage it safely; to prevent exposing their families to fibres which can develop into a deadly cancer. With your support and the support of other community leaders across Australia, we can maximise community awareness and education during November to encourage Aussies to learn how to identify, manage and dispose of asbestos safely.



I write to invite you to be a part of the next important milestone event for Adani's Carmichael Mine, North Galilee Basin Rail and Abbot Point Port projects.

On Friday, 20 October 2017, the Chairman and I will be joined by the Deputy Prime Minister, who will be turning the first sod for one of the largest single infrastructure — and job creating — projects in Australia's recent history, the **North Galilee Basin Rail**.

This important milestone event will be held in the rail corridor land, close to the Kirkwood's Homestead (west of Moranbah), commencing at 12pm.

- √ Final Investment Decision (FID) by the Board

- ✓ Official opening of the regional HQ in Townsville Office;
- ✓ Downer Mining being awarded the contract for the construction and operation of the Carmichael Mine project;
- ✓ AECOM awarded the contract for the surveying and design of the North Galilee Basin Rail;
- ✓ Austrak (Rockhampton) awarded \$82m concrete sleeper contract for the North Galilee Basin Rail: and
- ✓ Liberty OneSteel (Whyalla) being awarded a \$74m contract to supply railway steel for the North Galilee Basin Rail project
- ✓ Royalty agreement in place; and



✓ Land Compensation Agreements settled and acquisition of corridor underway.

As you are aware, Adani is committed to building a long-term future with regional Queensland and Australia more broadly. This important milestone event - along with recent important achievements - are a clear demonstration of our ongoing commitment to bringing these projects to fruition.

These projects will open up the Galilee Basin, provide over 10,000 direct and indirect jobs for Australians and re-invest \$22 billion in royalties back into local communities. Our projects are also part of India's massive plans to bring electricity to hundreds of millions of people in India to improve their quality of life and indeed provide them with better health, education and employment opportunities.
