Dear Mayor Lyn McLaughlin,

Last Monday (20 November) I was sitting on a plane, in between 2 people, both coincidentally from Ayr. I thought - this must be a special place. We 3 chatted the whole trip from Sydney to Townsville. The bloke on my right was gave me a document that had been mailed to him the previous week - indeed to every resident in the Shire. The Mayor's letter was dated the day of my travel - so it was very current.

From a little Council - and me with the 'southerner perspective' I was blown away!

Well done - what a brilliant document (the Emergency Action Guide). My role with the NSW Rural Fire Service is community engagement. I work with 5 of our fire districts - approx. 12 Shires based west of the Great Divide and north of the Riverina area. This is an unparalleled document. You should be absolutely commended... and proud of your outstanding effort. I see the need for such a document regularly, as I frequently answer community questions in all manner of forums about the matters you have addressed here.

Professionally I like how you have combined all natural disaster situations. I like the fact that it provides a 'what to do before', 'what to do during' and 'what to do after' call-outs for each style of emergency. Particularly for the bush fire component, I like the mix of words and images for preparation on page 27. Our organisation used to do this information well, but it appears to be recently overtaken by the Australian Red Cross who are promoting their disaster plan - possibly as a whole of Government response to reducing the cost of such document preparation. What such a process does is take away the specific nature of information presented. Your document is excellent (eg the inundation maps for storm surge). The Red Cross document is also drifts wider of the mark by suggesting that people should check their insurances etc, - when I believe the survival focus should be as your Shire has nailed it.

I also have a brother in law in a large commercial building firm in Cairns - who has been there 25 years, and I know he would be most complimentary of this document - cyclone Yasi as a prime example, but also as he works regularly on Murray Island & Thursday Island.

Demographically, I like what I see in terms of Burdekin Shire councillors. I warmed straight away to the images of you people leading the Shire, and what this local Government area is doing. Well done, you appear a sincere mix of suitably passionate and respected locals - a great advertisement for the District and the Shire.
