Thank you for the Burdekin Shire Council's (the council) letter of 18 December 2017, providing the proposed Local Government Infrastructure Plan (LGIP) for review and approval to proceed to public consultation.

I congratulate the council in taking the initiative to prepare a LGIP for its community. This is an important step to ensure the council continues to have the ability to levy charges or impose trunk infrastructure conditions on future development approvals.

The proposed LGIP has been assessed against the requirements of the repealed *Sustainable Planning Act 2009* and for compliance with the Statutory Guideline 01/16: Making and amending local planning instruments (MALPI) and Statutory Guideline 03/14: Local government infrastructure plans (Statutory Guideline 03/14). In accordance with MALPI, I am pleased to advise the council may now proceed to publicly consult on the proposed LGIP received on 19 January 2018. Further advice to assist the council in revising and refining the proposed LGIP is contained in **Enclosure 1**.


I note the council was previously granted an extension to 30 June 2018 to have a LGIP in place, otherwise it will not be able to continue to levy infrastructure charges or impose infrastructure conditions under section 111 of the *Planning Act 2016* (Planning Act).

As such, I strongly urge the council to prioritise the finalisation of the proposed LGIP to ensure it may continue to levy infrastructure charges. The Department of State Development, Manufacturing, Infrastructure and Planning (the department) is committed to working with the council, as a matter of priority, to help the finalisation and adoption of the proposed LGIP.

FURTHER ADVICE FOR THE BURDEKIN SHIRE COUNCIL'S CONSIDERATION ON THE PROPOSED LOCAL GOVERNMENT INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN (LGIP)

The following further advice is given to the Burdekin Shire Council for its consideration, so that it may further revise and refine the proposed LGIP:

- A valuable output of an LGIP is information about the cash flow projections which compares future infrastructure charges revenue to expenditure. In this regard, the state sets the maximum charges that a local government may levy for the provision of trunk infrastructure. Where expenditure exceeds the revenue from infrastructure charges, the local government has to consider options to manage it. Any shortfall in charges revenue to cover expenditure will have to be recovered from other sources such as rates.
- The LGIP preparation process seeks to take into account the inter-relationships and alignment between LGIP, future growth, Asset Management Plans (AMP) and Long-Term Financial Forecasts (LTFF). Within this framework, local governments have a responsibility to consider and strategically manage the provision and funding of trunk infrastructure in their local government area, in an efficient and financially sustainable manner. To achieve this over time, local governments are encouraged to undertake regular reviews to ensure ongoing alignment of its LGIP, AMP and LTFF.

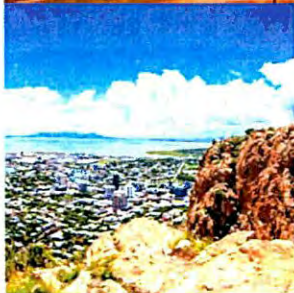

Blueprint for Active Australia

The Blueprint for an Active Australia outlines the case for change toward a more physically active Australia. It features 13 action areas developed by leading academics, reflecting a growing evidence base that reinforces the need for urgent, coordinated and concerted action. Heart Foundation Walking

Heart Foundation Walking is Australia's largest free walking network. It features community-based walking groups led by volunteer Walk Organisers, and a virtual community where individuals can track their physical activity.

Heart Foundation Walking aims to make regular physical activity enjoyable and easy, especially for people not used to being active.

The Heart Foundation works in partnership with Local Coordinators to set up walking groups in the community. Local Coordinators may be from health or community centres, councils or workplaces. The Heart Foundation provides Local Coordinators with training, resources and support to then assist volunteer Walk Organisers to recruit walkers and establish groups.

Heart healthy eating principles

The Heart Foundation's healthy eating principles were developed based on a review of the evidence available on the most optimal dietary pattern for heart health. Following the five heart healthy eating principles not only reduces the risk of cardiovascular disease and its major risk factors, but promotes heart health.

Councils can reinforce healthy eating messages to their community and others by ensuring they use the heart healthy eating principles as the basis for their catering and disseminating this information to their stakeholders.

Australian Heart Maps

- How your region ranks for specific heart-related hospitalisations (heart attack, heart failure, unstable angina).
- The association between heart disease and remoteness, disadvantage and Indigenous status.

- For developing Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing Plans.
- In advocating for healthy design and urban planning.
- For planning, coordinating and monitoring services.

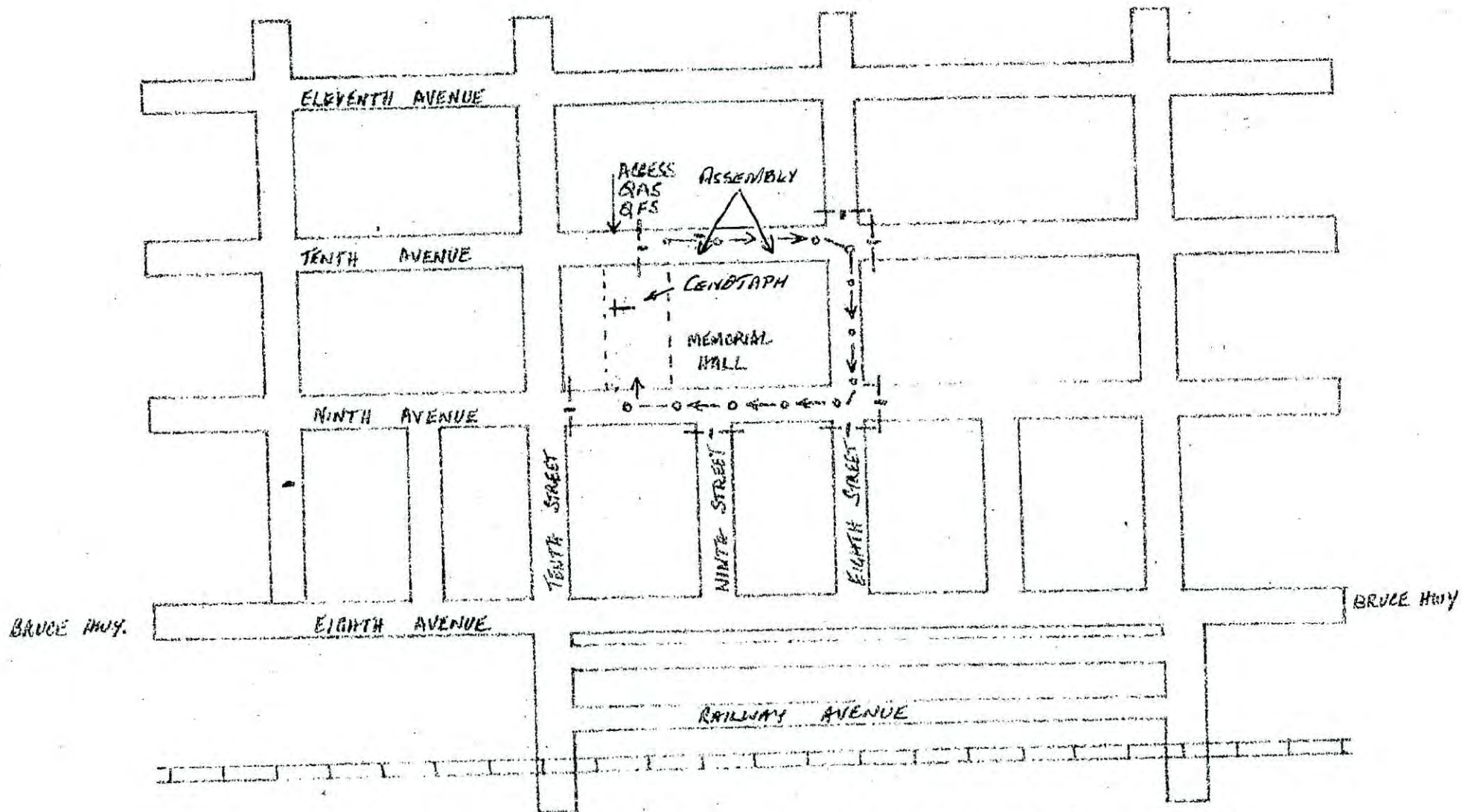

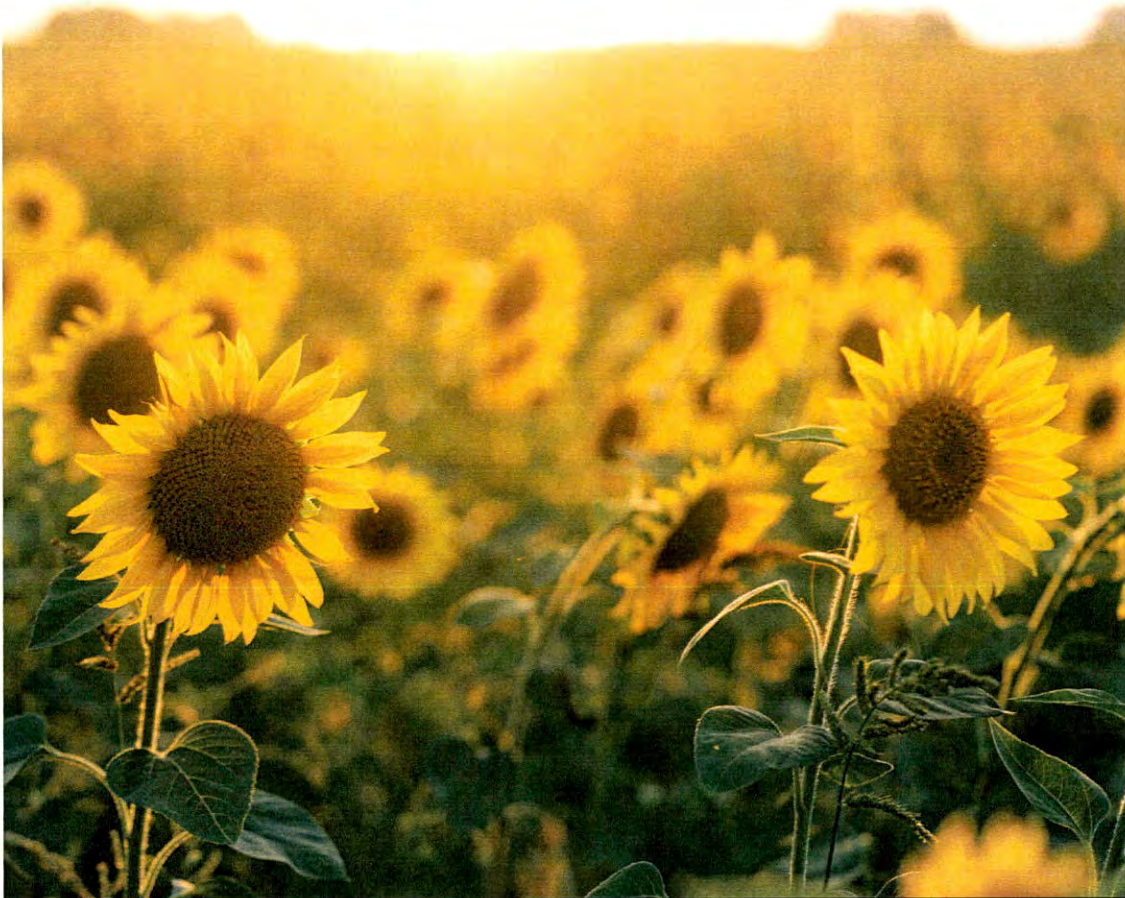
