The 2017-18 Natural Disaster Resilience Program (NDRP) is now open for funding applications for projects supporting natural disaster resilience activities.

I am pleased to advise that the Honourable Cameron Dick MP Minister for State Development, Manufacturing, Infrastructure and Planning and the Minister for Law Enforcement and Cyber Security Angus Taylor recently approved the 2017-18 NDRP.

The NDRP is jointly funded (50/50) by the Queensland and Australian Governments under the National Partnership Agreement on Natural Disaster Resilience and is administered by the Queensland Reconstruction Authority (QRA). Total funding available for the 2017-18 financial year is \$12 million and the applicant is expected to financially contribute to the project.

Funding can be sought for both infrastructure and non-infrastructure projects, such as education programs, flood studies and flood or bushfire risk management studies and plans.

Project applications should align with both the *National Strategy for Disaster Resilience*, and the four objectives underpinning our statewide all-hazards *Queensland Strategy for Disaster Resilience*:

- Queenslanders understand their disaster risk
- Strengthened disaster risk management
- Queenslanders are invested in disaster risk reduction
- Continuous improvement in disaster preparedness, response and recovery.



I write to you regarding the Local Government Legislation (Validation of Rates and Charges)
Amendment Act 2018 (the Amendment Act) which was passed by Parliament on 20 March 2018.

As you may be aware, the purpose of the Amendment Act is to amend the *City of Brisbane Act 2010* and the *Local Government Act 2009* to retrospectively validate all rates and charges levied by all Queensland Local Governments for each financial year up to and including the financial year ending 30 June 2018 where a Local Government failed to make a separate resolution to adopt those rates and charges. The Amendment Act also validates any actions or proceedings undertaken, or proposed to be taken, by a Local Government in relation to rates and charges captured within this scope.

These legislative changes came about following the Supreme Court of Queensland decision in the matter of *Linville Holdings Pty Ltd v Fraser Coast Regional Council* which found that the Council did not comply with section 94 of the *Local Government Act 2009* by passing a separate resolution when adopting its rates and charges.

Moving forward, it is important that Local Governments are familiar with the legislative requirements regarding the levying of rates and charges and I am aware that some Local Governments have already sought further training and advice in this regard.

The Department of Local Government, Racing and Multicultural Affairs has prepared a bulletin advising all Local Governments of the changes and the important requirements to follow when setting rates and charges for your community.

Further, the Local Government Association of Queensland (LGAQ) has recently published specific guidance material to assist Local Governments in meeting legislative requirements. The Best Practice Rating & Budget Resolutions – Decisions that must be made, or are ordinarily made, at a Budget Meeting provides specifically designed template resolutions and are available on the LGAQ's website at www.lgaq.asn.au.

As always, the Department is available to assist with any clarification or assistance required.

#### Dear Councillor McLaughlin

I am writing in relation to your Local Government Infrastructure Plan (LGIP) and to advise you that if your council wishes to continue to be able to levy infrastructure charges and condition for trunk infrastructure, it must have an approved LGIP adopted and incorporated into its planning scheme.

I understand that the Deputy Premier and former Minister for Infrastructure and Planning granted the council a two-year extension to deliver a LGIP for the community, with a final cut-off date of 30 June 2018. The Deputy Premier had previously written on 8 January 2016 to all local governments in Queensland advising of the requirements for each local government to apply for an extension of time to deliver an LGIP. For example, the council was required to plan towards the clear cut-off date, when preparing its LGIP project plan, to seek an extension from the State.

I also understand that the Deputy Premier's letter was followed by correspondence from the former Director General, Mr Frankie Carroll on 8 April 2016, to the Chief Executive Officers of all Queensland councils reminding councils of their responsibilities if they wished to develop an LGIP and the consequences of not having one in place by the extended deadline.

I am advised that this means the council has had four years to prepare and adopt its LGIP. With significant time already given, it is considered that this period is sufficient for the council to finalise its LGIP.

I can also confirm that under the *Planning Act 2016*, there is no mechanism for a local government to request an extension to its cut-off date. This is a matter of law and cannot be altered by administration or regulation actions by the government.

I note there are a range of councils, both small and large, that have successfully prepared and commenced their LGIPs.

Accordingly, I confirm that if council wishes to continue to levy infrastructure charges, or impose conditions about trunk infrastructure past the cut-off date, the council will need to ensure that it submits its proposed LGIP to me for approval, and adopts it, before that date. As the council would be aware, this timing will need to take into account its local government internal processes and state considerations, as well as the council's actions, to subsequently adopt it into the planning scheme.

If adoption of the LGIP does not occur by the cut-off date, the council will need to cease charging or conditioning for trunk infrastructure, until such time as its LGIP is in place.

The State is committed to working actively with the council to assist in the preparation of its LGIP and to facilitate the progress through the state's process. Administrative and operational assistance is available from the Department of State Development, Manufacturing, Infrastructure and Planning (department) to your council.
