On behalf of our 77 member councils, I am pleased to provide you with the Local Government Association of Queensland's (LGAQ) 2021 Advocacy Action Plan (AAP).

The AAP outlines our advocacy priorities to build a stronger local government sector and more resilient local communities.

As part of the LGAQ's commitment to member-led advocacy, the 2021 AAP includes 130 different points that reflect member-endorsed Annual Conference resolutions, Policy Executive directions and Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) objectives.

Priorities are grouped into eight key themes:

- Sustaining Local Jobs
- Strengthening our Regions
- Keeping Communities Safe
- Protecting our Environment
- Supporting Rural and Remote Communities
- Advancing First Nations Councils

The LGAQ's Advocacy Team will advance each member priority with the State and Federal governments through regular meetings, budget submissions, correspondence, participation in working and reference groups, sector forums, and – when appropriate – public campaigns.
