Rights of Appeal

The rights of an applicant to appeal to the Planning and Environment Court against a decision about a Development Application area set out in Chapter 6, Part 1 of the *Planning Act 2016*. There may also be the right to make an application for a declaration by Tribunal (refer Chapter 6, Part 2 of the Planning Act 2016).

An applicant for a development application may appeal to the Planning and Environment Court against the following:

- the refusal of all or part of the development application
- a provision of the development approval
- the decision to give a preliminary approval when a development permit was applied for
- a deemed refusal of the development application.

The timeframes for starting an appeal in the Planning and Environment Court are set out in section 229 of the *Planning Act 2016*.

A copy of the relevant appeal provisions from the *Planning Act 2016* is **attached**.

Approval Currency Period

Pursuant to Section 85 of the *Planning Act 2016*, the Development Approval will lapse four (4) years after the approval starts to have effect, unless otherwise conditioned. The currency period can only be extended if the request is received before the approval lapses.

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Notice About Decision – Statement of Reasons

This Notice is prepared in accordance with s63(5) and s83(7) of the *Planning Act 2016* to inform the public about a decision that has been made in relation to a development application. The purpose of the Notice is to enable a public understanding of the reasons for the planning decision, specifically having regard to:

- the relevant parts of the Planning Scheme and Assessment Benchmarks against which the application was assessed; and
- any other information, documents or other material Council was either required to, or able to, consider in its assessment.

All terms used in this Notice have the meanings given them in the Planning Act 2016.

Assessment Benchmarks

As the application was impact assessable it was assessable against the whole of the Planning Scheme.

The following assessment benchmarks particularly applied to the proposed development:

- Strategic Framework
- Rural zone code
- Reconfiguring a lot code
- Development works code
- Environmental significance overlay code
- Flood hazard overlay code.

Compliance with Assessment Benchmarks

The proposed development does not strictly comply with the following Assessment Benchmarks:

• Reconfiguring a Lot Code – PO10 Lot size and layout.

Council exercises its discretion to approve the application even though the development may not strictly comply with an aspect of the assessment benchmarks, as the proposal is generally consistent with the intent of the Strategic Framework and all other relevant assessment benchmarks including the Rural Zone Code.

Submissions

No properly made submissions were received during the notification period.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

Following an assessment of the change representations against the assessment benchmarks listed above, Council determined the proposed development is generally consistent with the relevant assessment benchmarks of the Burdekin Shire Planning Scheme December 2022 and will not cause significant adverse impacts on the surrounding natural environment, built environment and infrastructure, community facilities, or local character and amenity.

Impact assessable developments are individually assessed on their own merits in addition to relevant benchmarks. In particular, it is noted that the proposed development is considered to align with Item 3 (a) of Strategic Outcome 2.4.1 – Diverse Rural Futures, where all land in the rural zone is protected from fragmentation as result of the creation of small lot sizes below the minimum size nominated in the zone code. Reconfiguration creating lots below these minimum sizes does not occur, other than where:

(a) consolidating the balance of the farmed lot which is a minimum of 30ha and the single lot created contains a dwelling house that existed at the commencement of this planning scheme.

Chapter 6 Dispute resolution

Part 1 Appeal rights

229 Appeals to tribunal or P&E Court

- (1) Schedule 1 of the Planning Act 2016 states -
 - (a) Matters that may be appealed to -
 - (i) either a tribunal or the P&E Court; or
 - (ií) only a tribunal; or
 - (iii) only the P&E Court; and
 - (b) The person-
 - (i) who may appeal a matter (the appellant); and
 - (ii) who is a respondent in an appeal of the matter; and
 - (iii) who is a co-respondent in an appeal of the matter; and
 - (iv) who may elect to be a co-respondent in an appeal of the matter.

(Refer to Schedule 1 of the Planning Act 2016)

- (2) An appellant may start an appeal within the appeal period.
- (3) The appeal period is -
 - (a) for an appeal by a building advisory agency 10 business days after a decision notice for the decision is given to the agency; or
 - (b) for an appeal against a deemed refusal at any time after the deemed refusal happens; or
 - (c) for an appeal against a decision of the Minister, under chapter 7, part 4, to register premises or to renew the registration of premises 20 business days after a notice us published under section 269(3)(a) or (4); or
 - (d) for an appeal against an infrastructure charges notice 20 business days after the infrastructure charges notice is given to the person; or
 - (e) for an appeal about a deemed approval of a development application for which a decision notice has not been given 30 business days after the applicant gives the deemed approval notice to the assessment manager; or
 - (f) for any other appeal 20 business days after a notice of the decision for the matter, including an enforcement notice, is given to the person.

Note -

See the P&E Court Act for the court's power to extend the appeal period.

- (4) Each respondent and co-respondent for an appeal may be heard in the appeal.
- (5) If an appeal is only about a referral agency's response, the assessment manager may apply to the tribunal or P&E Court to withdraw from the appeal.
- (6) To remove any doubt. It is declared that an appeal against an infrastructure charges notice must not be about-
 - (a) the adopted charge itself; or
 - (b) for a decision about an offset or refund-
 - (i) the establishment cost of trunk infrastructure identified in a LGIP; or
 - (ii) the cost of infrastructure decided using the method included in the local government's charges resolution.

230 Notice of appeal

- (1) An appellant starts an appeal by lodging, with the registrar of the tribunal or P&E Court, a notice of appeal that-
 - (a) is in the approved form; and
 - (b) succinctly states the grounds of the appeal.
- (2) The notice of appeal must be accompanied by the required fee.
- (3) The appellant or, for an appeal to a tribunal, the registrar must, within the service period, give a copy of the notice of appeal to
 - (a) the respondent for the appeal; and
 - (b) each co-respondent for the appeal; and
 - (c) for an appeal about a development application under schedule 1, table 1, item 1 each principal submitter for the development application; and
 - (d) for and appeal about a change application under schedule 1, table 1, item 2 each principal submitter for the change application; and
 - (e) each person who may elect to become a co-respondent for the appeal, other than an eligible submitter who is not a principal submitter in an appeal under paragraph (c) or (d); and
 - (f) for an appeal to the P&E Court the chief executive; and
 - (g) for an appeal to a tribunal under another Act any other person who the registrar considers appropriate.

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- (4) The service period is -
 - (a) if a submitter or advice agency started the appeal in the P&E Court 2 business days after the appeal has started; or
 - (b) otherwise 10 business days after the appeal is started.
- (5) A notice of appeal given to a person who may elect to be a co-respondent must state the effect of subsection (6).
- (6) A person elects to be a co-respondent by filing a notice of election, in the approved form, within 10 business days after the notice of appeal is given to the person.

231 Other appeals

- (1) Subject to this chapter, schedule 1 and the P&E Court Act, unless the Supreme Court decides a decision or other matter under this Act is affected by jurisdictional error, the decision or matter is non-appealable.
- 2) The Judicial Review Act 1991, part 5 applies to the decision or matter to the extent it is affected by jurisdictional error.
- (3) A person who, but for subsection (1) could have made an application under the Judicial Review Act 1991 in relation to the decision or matter, may apply under part 4 of that Act for a statement of reasons in relation to the decision or matter.
- (4) In this section -

decision includes-

- (a) conduct engaged in for the purpose of making a decision; and
- (b) other conduct that relates to the making of a decision; and
- (c) the making of a decision or failure to make a decision, and
- (d) a purported decision; and
- (e) a deemed refusal.

non-appealable, for a decision or matter, means the decision or matter-

- (a) is final and conclusive; and
- (b) may not be challenged, appealed against, reviewed, quashed, set aside or called into question in any other way under the Judicial Review Act 1991 or otherwise, whether by the Supreme Court, another court, a tribunal or another entity; and
- (c) is not subject to any declaratory, injunctive or other order of the Supreme Court, another court, a tribunal or another entity on any ground.

232 Rules of the P&E Court

- (1) A person who is appealing to the P&E Court must comply with the rules of the court that apply to the appeal.
- (2) However, the P&E Court may hear and decide an appeal even if the person has not complied with the rules of the P&E Court.

Insofar as the application and its supporting material may be incomplete and/or inaccurate giving tide to any claim by a third party the applicant agrees to indemnity and save the council harmless in respect of any claim so arising.

4. Acid Sulfate Soils

Should the presence of acid sulfate soils or potential acid sulfate soils be detected, an Acid Sulfate Soils Management Plan may be required to be prepared and submitted to Council for approval.

5. Amenity Impacts

Use of the site is to be operated in a way that protects the values of the existing environment and will not cause unacceptable impacts on surrounding areas as a result of dust, odour, noise or lighting, in accordance with the *Environmental Protection Act 1994*.

6. Earthworks

Earthworks are not approved as part of this Development Permit. If any earthworks are required and deemed assessable development, an operational works development application is to be lodged with Council for assessment in accordance with relevant code/s and policy direction.

7. Reticulated Water Infrastructure

Proposed Lot 2 is unable to be connected to Council's reticulated water supply.

8. Miscellaneous

If any item of cultural heritage is identified during site works, all work must cease, and the relevant State Agency must be notified. Work can resume only after State Agency clearance is obtained.

The Applicant is reminded of their obligations under the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act, 2003 and the Torres Strait Islander Cultural Heritage Act 2003. Lots 1 and 2 Cancelling Lot 1 on RP720287






